Grammar and vocabulary lessons are built around frequently made errors and areas of difficulties when translating from English to French and vice-versa. The grammatical explanations, all in French, are generally introduced and then followed by application exercises such as fill-in-the-blank activities, rewriting of sentences and English to French translations. The book is divided into 46 chapters, each explaining rules around a particular part of speech (nouns, articles, adverbs etc.), a particular verb tense or a particular grammatical form (negative, interrogative...). The end of the book focuses on useful expressions and areas of possible confusion and provides various French/English annexes on verbs and adjectives. The index at the end of the book is all in French.</p>
